### KEN KERSCH WOWS PSMS WITH HIS SERVICE ON USS NEW JERSEY

The 818<sup>th</sup> meeting of the **Philadelphia Ship Model Society (PSMS)** was held at the **Independence Seaport Museum (ISM)** on the second day of July 2015. President **Tom McElhinney** called the meeting to order at 1910 and opened with the Pledge of Allegiance. Thirty-one persons attended including the guest speaker, **Ken Kersch**, and his wife **Evelyn, Betsy Nutt** and **Mary Rogers**.

Kevin Kersch and his wife Evelyn at July's PSMS meeting. Ken joined the Navy in 1966 and went to boot camp in the Great Lakes and was sent to USS Sion Lake AS-33. He started out on the deck force and then to outside machine shop working on Polaris subs. In November 1967 Ken was transferred to the USS New Jersey as part of the precommissioning crew. After training in San Diego he reported to the ship to work getting it ready for action. Ken worked in the machine shop repairing or making new parts for everything mechanical on the ship—including all weapons and ship systems. The "Big J" is the longest battleship built by the USA and is an Iowa-class battleship and the most decorated in the US Navy. Ken, thank you for a splendid evening! Hope to see you and Evelyn in the near future!








# PSMS July SHOW N' TELL



1. **Mike Zimmerman** brought his HMS *Belfast*, now cased and ready for delivery to a friend in England. The model is a 1/350 Trumpeter kit made of plastic and photo etch. The best feature of the kit is accuracy.



2. The Russian warship *Varwag*, circa 1900, is now about 35% complete. This is a scratch built model that **Ed Leaf** expects to complete in another month. The scale is 1/6"=1'.


3. **John Oddo** (left) brought pictures of the restored *C.C. Jones* which is not only named for the owner of the fishing boat, but also coincidentally the name of **John's** grandfather. Quasi nepotism aside **John** did a fine job of research, sewing sails and general restoration to produce a splendid model. One aspect of this job is the size of the model with sails about 5 feet high.

4. Another British fighting ship, the HMS *Majestic* (1896), was presented **by John Christinzio** (right photo). The model is a 1/96 Deans Marine kit that John is just starting. An interesting ship, the first of the largest class of battleships and the standard for the predreadnoughts. It was the last battleship to have side by side funnels. **John** says this is a great kit with simplicity of construction and organization of parts, easy instructions and online build portfolio.



5. John Esposito brought in his Indian Girl Canoe now in a Plexiglas case. Beautiful!

### Now hear this ...



The Independence Seaport Museum is gaining ground in its restoration of the USS Olympia, the oldest steel warship affoat in the world. But it's been a slow process that may rely on Gov. Tom Wolf approving millions in grant funding. Restoration for the 1123-year-old ship docked at Penn's Landing comes at a price tag of about \$14 million—including \$1 million just to move the ship and \$6 million for restoration work on the aging hull and deek. "That's the biggest challenge, raising the funds," said President and CEO John Brady. [See Jun 2, 2015 story by Fran Hilario in the Philadelphia Business Journal.

NOTE: All volunteers need to sign in and out from the museum from now on. The sign in book is located by the front desk on the podium. Boat shop volunteers will continue to sign in and out at the boat shop. Ships volunteers will sign in and out on the ships, unless they are coming into the museum and then they would sign in and out there as well. For PSMS, you will also need to sign in and out at the front desk.

Therefore if there is an emergency we will know who all is in the building at that time. If there is an emergency inside the museum, please exit the building and meet at the Walnut Street steps. For those on the ships, you will meet on the landing in front of the ships.

If you have been by the museum lately, you will have noticed the big changes happening on our galleries. We have taken down a large part of the main exhibit to make way for our new schooner, *Dillegence II*. It is exciting too for the Seaport Museum and we hope you can come down and lend a hand. # Now hear this continued ... DILIGENCE II UNDER CONSTRUCTION AT ISM



The skeleton of the ship is in place! (Picture to the Right). The transom end of the Schooner Diligence II, 65' long at the deck. The deck will be about 2' off the floor, and the hull fully planked with 1 1/2" poplar. The planks are 5" wide, and the public can watch the construction this week. The 2 masts will pierce the ceiling. *Joe Jordan*
