# **NEXT MEETING: 3 DECEMBER** ULIE BAKER



Julie Baker grew up in Delaware County where she was involved in all sorts of 2D and 3D art. She received a B.A. in Classical Archaeology with minors in Anthropology and Biology from Dartmouth College, worked as a field and lab archaeologist across the Mid-Atlantic, and as a paleontological preparator for the reinstallation of the dinosaur hall at the Academy of Natural Sciences. In order to qualify for application to graduate level programs in art conservation she volunteered at the Penn Museum and at Winterthur while taking additional courses in chemistry, art and art history. Julie earned an M.S. in Art Conservation with a specialization in Objects at the University of Delaware-Winterthur program, which included an advanced internship year at the Field Museum of Natural History. She pursued post graduate training as a Getty Fellow at the Philadelphia Museum of Art, was a Mellon Fellow at the Walters Art Museum, and worked as an NEH Project Conservator at The Brooklyn Museum. She has been in private practice for twenty-one years providing objects conservation services for museums, agencies, and individuals, including the PMA, The Barnes Foundation, Winterthur, the American Philosophical Society, the Mercer Museum, the City Philadelphia, and the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Julie has the distinct pleasure of working with Craig Bruns and the wonderful denizens of the Independence Seaport Museum on various fascinating projects over the past ten years. She has researched and treated a number of fabulous models- architectural, anatomical, industrial, and miniatures, and has been looking forward to this opportunity to learn and share in-depth (pun intended) about ship models with the members of the Philadelphia Ship Model Society.

# PSMS NOVEMBER SHOW N' TELL



(Left to Right):

- 1. Mike Zimmerman returned with his scratch built 1/96 model of the USS Vesuvius, a dynamite gunship of the US Navy from 1888-1922. He showed changes made since the previous month and explained the methods used to solve building questions that had arisen.
- 2. Francine Serratore brought in her scratch built 1/96 scale model of the *USS Olympia*. Francine is rebuilding this model and has now completed 85% of the changes and modifications. She walked us through the various parts she has changed and the work that is yet to be done. The *Olympia* is today tied up at a pier close to the **Independence Seaport Museum (ISM)**.
- 3. Fred Signor: As has become usual at our meetings a 110 foot radio controlled Sub Chaser was shown to the club. Fred has been working on the deck and its furniture. He showed us the gratings he built to replace those that came with the kit. This model is about 60 % complete.

## Now hear this ...



The Independence Scaport Museum is gaining ground in its restoration of the USS Olympia, the oldest steel warship affoat in the world. But it's been a slow process that may rely on Gov. Tom Wolf approving millions in grant funding. Restoration for the 123-year-old ship docked at Penn's Landing comes at a price tag of about \$14 million—including \$1 million just to move the ship and \$6 million for restoration work on the aging hull and deck. "That's the biggest challenge, raising the funds," said President and CEO John Brady. [See Jun 2, 2015 story by Fran Hilario in the Philadelphia Business Journal.



United States Coast Guard USA

This stamp honors the United States Coast Guard for its role in protecting the security of the nation and advancing its vital maritime interests. In an oil painting on masonite, renowned aviation artist William S. Phillips depicts two icons of the Coast Guard: the cutter Eagle, a three-masted sailing ship known as "America's Tall Ship," and an MH-65 Dolphin helicopter, the standard rescue aircraft of the Coast Guard. One hundred years ago the agency received its current name, when President Woodrow Wilson signed into law the 1915 "Act to Create the Coast Guard." The origins of the Coast Guard, however, go back to 1790, when President George Washington signed into law an act that provided for a fleet of ten boats, or "revenue cutters," to aid in "the collection of duties ... imported into the United States."Today's Coast Guard has 38,000 active-duty men and women; 8,000 Reservists; and many volunteer auxiliary personnel. In addition to saving lives at sea, their responsibilities include enforcing maritime law, overseeing aids to navigation, carrying out icebreaking operations, protecting the marine environment, responding to oil spills and water pollution, ensuring port security, supporting scientific research at sea, combating terrorism, and aiding in the nation's defense. Phil Jordan was the art director for the stamp. The United States Coast Guard stamp is being issued as a Forever® stamp.
