SAILING THE BRITISH EMPIRE

The Voyage of the "Clarence" 1858-73

A well researched presentation of one of Green & Co Blackwall frigates' voyages through the Victorian Empire of 1858 - 73. The story was told using several ships' handwritten logs that described, some in great detail, the conditions and health hazards of Victorian ships carrying diverse passengers - soldiers, indentured laborers, and free migrants. It included accidents such as man overboard, criminal acts, deaths and births on board, epidemics and a catastrophic storm; an overlapping story to the British convict ships to Australia.




JOE JORDAN

TOM MC ELHINNEY


Showed his progress since last month of the 1913 pleasure yacht "ALICE" along with a photograph scirca 1913. Scratch built, the stern section has now been defined.
