PRIVATEERING AND THE CONTINENTAL NAVY DURING THE AMERICAN REVOLUTION:

The origins of the American Navy





An excellent presentation was given by Nick Firling of the Battleship New Jersey. Well prepared and illustrated, Nick knew his subject. He showed examples of Privateers' ships and cited their victories and defeats and pointed out that the Continental Navy was not the U.S. Navy. During the revolution, the colonies did not call themselves the United States. The U.S. Navy claims October 13th 1775 as the date off its official establishment when the Second Continental Congress passed a resolution creating the Continental Navy. However, with the end of the Revolutionary War, the Continental Navy was disbanded. Under George Washington, threats to American merchant shipping by Barbary Pirates, lead to the Naval Act of 1794 which created a permanent standing U.S.Navy.

The Secret Language of Ships



This photo was taken from a tug that's moving in on a ship, guided by white arrows pointing to the "chocks" that house small but strong posts called "bitts." The tug fastens lines to these bitts.

SWL 50t means that the safe working load for each bitt is 50 tons. Once a tug has fastened a line to the bitt, it will exert no more than 50 tonnes of pulling pressure as it helps the ship brake or negotiate docking.


The Ship Model Shack



ELIZABETH'S SEA DOGS

By Hugh Bicheno


Elizabeth's Sea Dogs investigates the rise and fall of s unique group of adventurers. Men like Francis Drake, John Hawkins, Martin Frobisher and Walter Raleigh. Seen by the English as heroes but by the Spanish as pirates, they were expert seafarers and extremely tough men in extremely hard times. They



defeated the Spanish Armada and made Queen Elizabeth I extremely wealthy if seldom grateful. Author Hugh Bicheno sets the Sea Dogs in Historical context and reveals their lives through diligent historical research with color plates and the author's own maps and technical drawings.

THE CRUISE OF THE LANIKA By Kemp Tolley

In early December 1941 in the Philippines, a young Navy Ensign named Kemp Tolley was given his first ship command, an old 76 foot schooner that had once served as a movie prop in John Ford's "The Hurricane." Crewed mostly by Philipinos who did not speak English and armed with a canon from the Spanish-American War, the Lanika was ordered to sail south to spy on



the Japanese fleet. Events overtook the plan when Pearl Harbor was bombed before Lanikai could get under way. When Bataan and Corregidor fell, he was ordered to set sail for Australia and became one of the few U.S. naval vessels to escape the Philippines. Tolley's description of their escape ranks with the best of sea tales.



TABLETOP, SAILS OF GLORY/AGE OF SAIL GAME Scale 1/1200

Played with plastic ships. Can be played with simple or advanced rules using a variety of chips and a ruler. Ships are maneuvered in a realist manner. Great simulation for Fighting Sail.

Joe collects "Things not as they seem". He presented 3 objects that, at first glance, looked like 2 cannon and a ship replica. In fact, they were radios! Guess you can see, he collects anything nautical.

Also, Joe went on the Italian Tall Ship *Vespucci* which is a "teaching ship" with a crew of over 400 but no one spoke English!

Very entertaining.

Joe presented a work in progress. A Dumas kit that he started and put aside 20 years ago. Unhappy with it, he stripped it to the bare wood and refinished the wood applying 11 coats of polyurethane varnish, wet sanding between coats moving towards scotch bright. The lettering was cut out with an exacto knife from pressure sensitive vinyl attached to frisket paper and then pealed off and applied to the hull. It was then varnished over which embedded it into the finish. Joe says it will need 6 or 7 more coats of varnish. All fittings will be redone. When finished, it will be radio controlled.

Materials used in the kit-wood, plastic resin balsa Owl eyes, brass etc. The hull is from MBT HULLS, Gibraltar, the superstructure kit is from CNC Models. Both can be purchased from CNC.

FREMM is a French/Italian cooperation and stands for Frigate Replacement European Marine

Modernization. The ships are heavily stealth and automated and while being heavily armed, in many navies they would be considered destroyers due to their large size and capabilities. Both France and Italy have sold them to Egypt, Algeria and Greece. The U.S. Navy is looking at building them at the Martin Marietta Facility in Wisconsin.


COASTAL UTILITY CRAFT

CHINESE PIRATES PLUNDER 10 SHIPWRECKS CARRYING REMAINS OF UK'S WWII HEROES

Ten British ships sunk during WWII and designated as war graves have been plundered for scrape metal by Chinese pirates. British Secretary of Defense Gavin Williamson has demanded an immediate investigation.



Experts previously said that 6 ships had been plundered. Now they have revealed that 4 more have been targeted, and the figure is likely to rise. The ten are lying off the coasts of Malaysia and Indonesia. They include HMS

Prince of Wales and HMS Repulse.

Even worse is the fate of the heavy cruiser HMS Exeter, which famously confronted the doomed Graf Spee in the battle of the River Platte. It went down off Indonesia in 1942, but sadly, no trace of her is left on the seabed.

Chinese-owned barges fitted with cranes have been carrying out the illegal operations.

Experts say WWII vessels are particularly valuable as they were built and sunk before the era of nuclear explosions. As a result, they have absorbed little of the background radiation from the atmosphere, making them suitable for medical equipment.

In recent years, the wrecks of Prince of Wales and Repulse, a 750ft-long battlecruiser, have been ripped apart and experts believe half their structures are gone.

More than a dozen Chinese owned barges have been involved in the salvage. Some switch off their transponders to avoid detection. They then drop a 50 ton axe-shaped anchor on the sunken ship to smash its structure. Long cranes scoop up the smashed metal. The metal haul from each ship can fetch more than \$1.5 million dollars. *Continued on next page*

SS LOCH RANZA

Newley plundered. Sunk off the coast of Indonesia. 1942

HMS TIEN KWANG

Newley plundered. Sunk south of Singapore. 1942

HMS KUALA

Newley plundered. Sunk south of Singapore. 1942

HMS BANKA

Newley plundered. Sunk off Maylasia 1941 Nothing of it remains.

HMS REPULSE

Battlecruiser, Sunk 1941. Propellers and shafts have been removed.

HMS ENCOUNTER

Sunk in the battle of the Java Sea. 80% percent of the ship has been removed

HMS ELECTRA

Sunk 3 days before Encounter. About half the ship has been looted.

HMS EXETER

Sunk in the battle of the Java sea. Nothing remains on the sea bed.

HMS THANET

Sunk near Malaysia, 1942. Has since been "broken up" **HMS Prince of Wales**

Sunk in 1942. Has lost more than half her hull plates.

Sixty per cent of the shipwreck HMAS Perth gone after illegal scrap metal salvaging

Jakarta: A team of Indonesian and Australian divers has made the shocking discovery that 60 percent of WWII shipwreck HMAS Perth has vanished, with evidence of large scale illegal salvaging for scrap metal at the site off the coast of Java.

"This isn't what we were hoping to find," Said Australian National Maritime Museum director Kevin Sumption.

It is with profound with profound regret we advise that our joint maritime archaeologists diving team has discovered sections of Perth missing.

Mr Sumption said interim reports after a search dive conducted on May 14 to 17 and an earlier remote sensing survey indicated only about 40 per cent of HMAS Perth remained.
