

NEWLY RESTORED HISTORIC SAILING SHIP CRASHES AND SINKS DAYS AFTER RELAUNCH

A historic sailing ship has crashed just days after taking to water following an extensive renovation project. The 121-foot *Elbe No.5* collided with the 466-foot *Astroprinter* a Cyprus-flagged cargo ship, on the Elbe river near Hamburg, Germany on June 17, 2019.

Elbe No.5 was built in 1883, making it the city's oldest fully wooden ship. It recently underwent significant renovation work according to the Hamburg Maritime Foundation. After decades as a pilot boat used to guide larger ships into Hamburg port, Elbe No. 5 was sold to American journalist Warwick Tomkins, who used it as a houseboat. In 2002, it was bought by the Hamburg Foundation to be used as a pleasure boat for tourists.



ANNAPOLIS TRAINING CRUISE VISITS PHILADELPHIA

Three yard patrol (YP) craft visited Penn's Landing during their summer cruise up the east coast. During the cruise, the midshipmen spend approximately a month aboard the YPs, visiting Philadelphia, Boston, New York City and Newport, R.I. Along the way, they learn about and practice every aspect of shipboard life - navigation, seamanship, damage control, rules of the road, shipboard life etc.








The YPs are used to teach familiarization with watercraft, basic damage control and underway instruction from damage control to advanced seamanship and navigation for midshipmen at the U.S. Naval Academy at Annapolis, Maryland and Officer Candidate School, Newport, Rhode Island, and used by the U.S. Naval Sea Cadets Corps for damage control and seamanship familiarization out in the fleet.

JEWISH PIRATES OF THE CARIBBEAN

How a generation of swashbuckling Jews carved out an empire in the New World in their quest for treasure, religious freedom and revenge.

At the end of the 15th century, the Spanish Inquisition forced many Jews to flee the country. The most adventurous among them took to the high seas as freewheeling outlaws. In ships bearing names such as Prophet Samuel, Queen Ester, and Shield of Abraham, they attacked and plundered the Spanish fleet while forming alliances with other European powers to ensure the safety of Jews living in hiding. Jewish Pirates of the Caribbean is the entertaining saga of a hidden chapter in Jewish history and of the cruelty, terror and greed that flourished during the Age of Discovery. Among the many daring figures in the book are the great Jewish Pirate Sinan, Barbarossa's second in command; Rabi Samuel Palache and his brother, Joseph, who went from commanding pirate ships to to founding the first openly Jewish community in the New World. Filled with high seas adventure.


LONGITUDE

The True Story of a Lone Genius Who Solved the Greatest Scientific Problem Of His Time.

Anyone alive in the eighteenth century would have known that "the longitude problem" was the thorniest scientific dilemma of the day and had been for centuries. Lacking their ability to measure their longitude, sailors through the great ages of exploration had been literally lost at sea as soon as they lost sight of land. Thousands of lives and the increasing fortunes of nations, hung on a resolution. The scientific solution, from Galileo to Sir Issac Newton had mapped the hemispheres in pursuit of celestial answer.

One man, John Harrison, dared to imagine a mechanical solution. A clock that would keep precise time at sea, something no clock had been able to do on land. Longitude is the dramatic story of an epic scientific quest and Harrison's forty year obsession with building his perfect time piece, known today as the chronometer. Full of heroism and chicanery, it is also a fascinating brief history of astronomy, navigation, and clockmaking, and opens a new window on our world.


SEPTEMBER 7, 2019 10AM to 4PM
